


Program Highlight of the Month

Unlock Your Memory: Memoir Writing.

Gabrielle Esposito will lead you through a series of engaging exercises and prompts that will help attendees delve into their memories, uncovering the stories that shape their lives. This workshop will provide practical techniques for capturing vivid details, crafting compelling narratives, and preserving personal legacies.

Gabrielle Esposito holds a degree in Creative Writing from SUNY Geneseo. Her short stories have appeared in esteemed publications such as The Manhattanville Review, 34TH Parallel, and Gandy Dancer, among others. Notably, her story "The Way Home" earned second place in the 2023 Doro Boehme Fiction Editors' Prize and was nominated for the 2024 Best American Short Stories anthology.
